

NOTICE TO VOTERS
For Lincoln, VT Local Election March 3, 2026
Polling place: Burnham Hall, 52 East River Road
Polls open: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

BEFORE ELECTION DAY:

CHECKLIST POSTED at Clerk's Office by Feb. 1, 2026. If your name is not on the checklist, then you must register to vote.

SAMPLE BALLOTS will be posted, and early voting will begin by Feb. 11, 2026.

REGISTER TO VOTE: An eligible voter may submit an application for addition to the checklist, to the Town Clerk of the town in which they claim to be a resident. Applications may be submitted in person, by mail, or through the VT Secretary of State's online voter registration website: <http://olvr.vermont.gov>. Applications shall be accepted until the close of polls, at 7:00 p.m. on March 3, 2026. To avoid delays at the polls, please register before Election Day, if possible. [See 17 V.S.A. §2121, 17:2144(b)]

REQUEST EARLY or ABSENTEE BALLOTS: A voter or a person authorized by the voter, may request early or absentee ballots at any time during the year of the election. The deadline to request ballots is 2:00 p.m. on March 2, 2026. 17 V.S.A. 2531(a), 2532(a).

Request your absentee ballot in any of these ways:

1. **Online via My Voter Page:** <https://mvp.vermont.gov/> (This method is preferred.)
2. **E-mail (clerk@lincolnvermont.org)** It is important to include your mailing address and phone number with your request, so the clerk can reach you in a timely manner.
3. **Call your Town Clerk at (802) 453-2980.**
4. **Make your ballot request in person at the Town Office.** (If you call ahead, we can have it ready for you when you arrive.) If nobody is in the office, leave a written request in the drop box with your contact information.

WAYS TO VOTE YOUR EARLY or ABSENTEE BALLOT:

- **IMPORTANT:** Read and follow all instructions that come with your absentee ballot, or your vote may not count!
- You may vote in-person at the town clerk's office prior to 2:00 pm on March 3, 2025.
- A voter may take their ballot(s) from the clerk's office and return them as if the ballot(s) were received by mail.
- Have ballot(s) mailed to you, and mail or deliver them back to the Clerk's Office before Election Day, or to the polling place before 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.
- If you are sick or disabled before Election Day, ask to have two justices of the peace bring a ballot to you at your home.
- Voted ballots must be received by the Town Clerk by 7:00 p.m. on March 4, 2025, in order to be counted. Return voted ballots to the secure drop box outside the town office, or send them by mail, or bring them to the polling place on Mar. 4, 2025.

ON ELECTION DAY:

If your name was dropped from the checklist in error, or has not been added even though you submitted a timely application for addition to the checklist, explain the situation to your town clerk and ask that your name be added to the checklist today. If the clerk or Board of Civil Authority does not add your name, you can appeal the decision to a superior court judge, who will settle the matter on Election Day. Call the Vermont Secretary of State's Office at 1-802-828-2363 for more information.

If you are a first-time voter who submitted your application to the checklist individually online or by mail, you must provide a valid photo identification, or a copy of a utility or bank statement, or a government document containing your current address, before you vote for the first time.

If you have physical disabilities, are visually impaired, or can't read, you may have assistance from any person of your choice. If any voters you know have disabilities, let them know they can have assistance from any person of their choice.

If you know voters who cannot get from their vehicle into the polling place, let them know that ballot(s) may be brought to their car by two election officials. Call the Town Clerk to arrange this, or park in the handicapped space outside the polling place and honk your horn. **If you have any questions or need assistance while voting, ask your town clerk or any election official for help. NO PERSON SHALL:

- Vote more than once per election, either in the same town or in different towns.
- Mislead the board of civil authority about your own or another person's true residency or other eligibility to vote.
- Hinder or impede a voter going into or from the polling place.
- Socialize in a manner that could disturb other voters in the polling place.
- Offer bribe, threaten or exercise undue influence to dictate or control the vote of another person.

If you believe that any of your voting rights have been violated, you may file an Administrative Complaint with the Secretary of State's Office, 128 State Street, Montpelier, VT 05633.

If you believe you have witnessed efforts to commit any kind of fraud or corruption in the voting process, you may report this to your local United States Attorney's Office.

If you have witnessed actual or attempted acts of discrimination or intimidation in the voting process, you may report this to the Civil Rights Division of the United States Department of Justice at (800) 253-3931.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTERS at the POLLING PLACE

CHECK-IN AND RECEIVE BALLOTS:

- Go to the entrance checklist table.
- Give your name and, if asked, street address to the election official in a loud voice.
- Wait until your name is repeated and checked off by the official.
- An election official will give you a ballot.
- Enter within the guardrail and go to a vacant voting booth.

MARK YOUR BALLOT: For each office listed on the ballot, you will see instructions to "Vote for not more than one, or Vote for not more than two, etc."

- To vote, **fill in the oval** to the right of your choice on the ballot.
- **WRITE-IN** candidate(s). To vote for someone whose name is not printed on the ballot, use the blank "write-in" lines on the ballot and either write-in the name or paste on a sticker, then fill in the oval to the right of the write-in line. Stay within the write-in box.

CHECK OUT:

- Go to the exit checklist table and state your name in an audible voice.
- Wait until your name is repeated and checked off by the official.

CAST YOUR VOTE by depositing your voted ballot into the proper ballot box or tabulator machine.

LEAVE the voting area immediately by passing outside the guardrail.
